CHECKLIST FOR MAINSTREAMING

THE REGULAR CLASSROOM TEACHER

- Have I had an opportunity to meet the child?
- Do I have enough information and background on the child to effectively program for him?
- 3. Do I really feel that the child is appropriate for mainstreaming in my class-room?
- 4. Am I willing to develop my knowledge and understanding of learning handicaps and the needs of this student?
- 5. Has the total plan for this child been explained to me?
- 6. Am I willing to team with other staff and specialists in monitoring the child's total program?
- 7. Are clear strategies planned for giving me support and information?
- 8. Am I willing to ask for and accept help?
- Am I willing to learn and adopt techniques for helping the child in my classroom?
- 10. Have I developed the best plan for scheduling, and groupings for various instructional activities?
- 11. Am I willing to give my time and energy to help this child find success in my classroom?
- 12. Am I willing to encourage close and ongoing communication with the parents?
- Do I feel empathy, not sympathy, for the exceptional/LH child?
- Do I really feel that the child can make it?

THE SUPPORT SYSTEM

- What is the support system for the child? Does it include regular services by specialists or other school personnel?
- 2. Is there an action plan for monitoring the child's progress in the classroom?
- 3. How frequently can I use the school team for assistance?
- 4. How often will a formal review of the child's total educational program be held?
- 5. Who should I contact for information or when problems arise?
- 6. How accessible are specialists and other resource personnel?
- 7. Are any needed changes in my classroom arrangement completed?
- 8. Is there a plan to orient my other students? How will I do this?
- 9. Do I have a definite plan to welcome the exceptional/LH child on his/her first day?
- 10. Do I have appropriate materials for his/her first day?
- 11. Have I planned appropriate groupings for the exceptional/LH child?
- 12. Is recommended materials or equipment ready for the child's first day in my classroom?
- 13. Will someone demonstrate use and trouble-shooting of this equipment before the child is placed?
- 14. If the child will be using his/her personal (needed) aids, who will do the required orientation for me?
- 15. Where are additional information sources?
