Getting Started:

1. Register for the course on Websmart <https://websmart.smccd.edu/> then go to my website <http://www.smccd.edu/accounts/moss/> and there you will find all the course details including the syllabus, schedule, homework assignments, homework guidelines, MyOpenMath navigation, and letters from past students.
2. Complete the mandatory online orientation by August 18. The orientation information is on my website and will be available August 15 if you want to get an early start.
